## Rosalie Dampf, née Ettlinger Deported to Theresienstadt in 1942.

Rosalie was born in Bretten on August 24th 1869. In 1894 she married a butcher, Emil Dampf, born in Nordstetten on July 23rd 1869. The marriage took place in Cannstatt. The couple ran a kosher butcher's in 310 Neckarstrasse in Horb. Their daughter Frieda was born in 1896. In 1920 Frieda married Hermann Gideon from Horb and the couple fled to the USA in 1939.

In 1928 Emil Dampf let his butcher's shop to Leopold Liebmann, a Jewish butcher from Ellar near Limburg. When Liebmann moved to Rexingen with his family in 1934 to take over 'Gasthaus zur Ratsstube', Emil's son-in-law renovated and modernized the shop, let it to a Christian butcher and later sold it in 1938.

Emil Dampf died on January 18th 1941 in a state of mental confusion. He was the last to be buried in the cemetery in Horb before the deportations started in December 1941.

Rosalie Dampf was forced to move to Rexingen on June 25th 1941. She was deported to Theresienstadt in 1942 and on September 26th of that year she was taken to Treblinka where she was murdered in the gas chamber.
