Isidor and Klara David, née Löwenstein Deported to Theresienstadt in 1942.

Klara Löwenstein was born in Rexingen on November 26th, 1875. Her parents were Berta Bäritz from Affaltrach and the trader Salomon Löwenstein. She grew up in Schöller, today 5 Schöllerstrasse. Her brother, Max Löwenstein, lived in Tübingen. He and his wife were also later deported to Theresienstadt.


Klara married Isodor David from Gimbsheim in the Palatinate, born on August 3rd 1873. The couple had four children: Salomon, Otto, Paula and Julie. All four managed to emigrate.

Klara and Isidor David were deported to Theresienstadt in 1942. In October 1943 Isidor sent a postcard from Theresienstadt to the Vögele family writing that they were "fine".

Klara's death is dated October 28th 1944 in an obituary in the Jewish newspaper Aufbau in New York. On February 5th 1945 Isidor David was transported by the Red Cross from Theresienstadt to Switzerland.

The Association of Orthodox Rabbis in the USA and Canada had asked help of the Swiss Minister, Jean Marie Musy. Musy was known for his German-friendly attitude and his good relationship to Himmler. He managed to have 1,200 Jews taken from Theresienstadt to Switzerland in February 1945. Isidor David died in a refugee camp there on December 31st 1945.
