Amanda Gundelfinger, née Augsburger Deported to Riga in 1942.

Amanda Augsburger was born in Horb on November 3rd 1881. She was the daughter of Franzisca Petersberger and Louis Augsburger. In July 1906 she married Samuel Sally Gundelfinger, a merchant from Augsburg. He died in October 1938 and is buried in the cemetery in Horb. Contemporary witnesses related that Amanda became depressive after the death of her husband. She was admitted to the Jacoby'sche Mental Hospital in Sayn near Koblenz which was reserved for Jewish patients. After her dismissal she moved to Stuttgart in July 1941 and was deported from there to Riga.

Her unmarried sister Mina Augsburger, born on June 19th 1884, was admitted to the Jacoby'sche Mental Hospital on June 19th 1941. From there she was deported to the extermination camp in Sobibor in Poland via Cologne and Düsseldorf on June 15th 1942. She was murdered there.
