Sally, Lothar, Erich and Siegwart Lemberger Deported to Riga in 1941.

Sally Lemberger, born on November 29th 1923, was the eldest son of Rosa and Isidor Lemberger and the only one of the family to survive. As soon as he graduated from elementary school he was forced to work on the railway. In 1940 he briefly attended a course in agriculture for those emigrating to Palestine. He survived several concentration camps and was liberated in Theresienstadt on May 8th 1945. Together with other survivors from Baden-Württemberg, he lived in Stuttgart Degerloch in 1945/46.

He often visited his home town Rexingen and in 1946 emigrated to the USA where, in 1947, he married Ruth Lang from Süssen, a survivor of Riga.

Siegwart, the second son of Rosa and Isidor Lemberger, was born on March 10th 1927. The third son, Lothar, was born on April 8th 1933 and the youngest son, Erich, was born on September 4th 1935. At the time of their deportation the children were 14, 8 and 6 years old respectively. They were probably shot together with their mother in the forest of Bikernieki in March 1942.
