Samuel and Jeanette Levi, née Hahn Deported to Riga in 1941.

Jeanette Hahn was born in the Franconian town of Nenzenheim near Kitzingen on March 27th 1883.

On August 18th 1913 she married the cattle-dealer Samuel Levi who was born in Rexingen on December 20th 1883 to Karoline Rödelsheimer and Isak Levi. He was a member of the reserve brigade in World War 1. The family lived in 123 Im Kapf, today 19 Kirchstrasse. The building has since been pulled down. On July 9th 1920 their daughter Kläre Käthe was born and on December 1st 1924 their son Isbert. On January 31st 1939 Samuel Levi was forced to close his business. His son Isbert managed to flee to Sweden with a transport of children in 1939. In 1940 Kläre Käthe Levi married Werner Abel from Geseke near Paderborn. The couple was deported and murdered.
