Senta Levi Deported to Riga in 1941.

Senta was born in Rexingen on June 25th 1906. Her parents were Sofie Dannhauser from Buchau and Simon Levi. Her brother Josef was seven years older than she. Her father died six months after her birth. Her mother then married the cattle-dealer, Louis Levi, younger brother of her late husband. They lived in 55 Mitten im Dorf, today 19 Bergstrasse. Her brother Josef was a horse-dealer in Kanonenweg, Stuttgart and was deported from Stuttgart to Riga.

With the advance of the Russian Army, Senta Levi was presumably transported by the SS across the Baltic Sea to Neustadt in Eastern Holstein, together with other survivors of the concentration camp in Stutthof near Danzig. She died in Neustadt on May 10th 1945 after liberation by the English Army. In Neustadt there is a Jewish cemetery for those who died shortly before or after liberation. In May 2003 the tombstones were smeared with red paint by a Neo-Nazi organization who also left a slashed piglet in the cemetery. The perpetrators were caught.
