Siegfried Levi Deported to Izbica in 1942.

Siegfried was born in Mühringen on July 16th 1877. His parents were Adolf and Hannchan Levi. He was deaf and dumb, unmarried and worked as a tailor. Up to 1938 he worked in Julius Berlizheimer's clothing factory in Mühringen which was his parental home, 130 Neue Strasse, today 3 Neue Strasse. He was a hard-working man and was respected in the village. His brother Sigmund, co-owner of the Berlizheimer firm, managed to flee to the USA with his family in May 1941. His sister Klara died in Theresienstadt.

Siegfried was forced to move to Rexingen shortly before his deportation on April 17th 1942.
