Wilhelm and Toni Levi, née Frank Deported to Riga in 1941

Wilhelm Levi was born in Haigerloch on May 22nd 1884. He was the son of Leopold Levi and Mina Schwab. As a young man he moved to Horb where he opened a tailoring business in 14 Schillerstrasse. In 1921 he married Toni Karoline Sidonia Frank from

Horb. She was born on July 8th 1897 and was the daughter of Sidonie Niederheimer from Franconia and Martin Frank. Sidonie died three weeks after Toni's birth. Martin Frank married again. Toni, however, remained an only child.

Wilhelm and Toni Levi had one son, Leopold, who was born on June 23rd 1922. He attended school in Horb and emigrated to the USA in 1937.

On September 17th 1940 Toni and Wilhelm moved to the Jewish area of Haigerloch known as "Im Haag". Wilhelm's brother Hermann Levi, who was still living there, had been forced to close his textile business in 1938.

In 1941 Toni and Wilhelm Levi were deported to Riga. Hermann was also deported to Riga. Two years later he was taken to Auschwitz where he was murdered.
