## Auguste Löwenstein Deported to Riga in 1941.

Auguste was born in Rexingen on November 9th 1892. Her parents were Pauline Bodenheimer from Durbach in Baden near Offenburg and the cattle-dealer Wolf Löwenstein from Rexingen. She had two siblings from the first marriage of her father with Julia Oppenheimer from Gemmingen: Viktor Löwenstein, born in 1885, a soldier in World War I who was killed in the summer of 1914, and Julie, born in 1890. Julie married a Christian in Stuttgart in 1921. Auguste's sister, Lina, was born on December 14th 1893.

Auguste Löwenstein was unmarried and worked as a housemaid in Stuttgart. In April 1938 she moved back to Rexingen to live with her widowed mother who ran a grocer's shop selling colonial products in 30 Oben im Dorf, today 74 Schafblumenhalde. Her mother died in 1940.

Auguste's sister Lina managed to flee to the USA. Her stepsister Julie was deported to Theresienstadt and survived.
