Fanny Zürndorfer, née Mayer Deported to Theresienstadt in 1942.

Fanny Mayer was born in Heidelsheim near Bruchsal on May 5th 1871. She married Hugo Zürndorfer from Rexingen who was born on July 14th 1867. He was the son of Ida Hilb and Max Wolf Zürndorfer and the brother of flight lieutenant Josef Zürndorfer.

The couple lived in Ichenhausen in Bavaria where Hugo ran a waterworks. They had two children, a son Gustav who fled to Shanghai in 1939 and a daughter Ruth who married Max Waldmann with whom she emigrated.

After the death of her husband in 1928, Fanny Zürndorfer moved first to Ulm and later, in 1935, to Rexingen. In 1939 she went to the Jewish home for the aged in Herrlingen near Ulm. In 1942 she and all the other occupants of the home were forced to move to Oberstotzingen. In 1942 she was deported from Stuttgart to Theresienstadt and from there taken to Treblinka on September 29th 1942.
