

Hedwig Sinn, née Weil
Deported to Riga in 1941.

Hedwig was born in Rexingen on December 25th 1888. She was the youngest daughter of Sofie Löwenstein and Moritz Weil. The family lived in 106 Unten im Dorf, today 7 Freudenstädter Strasse. Sofie had two older sisters, Auguste born in 1876, and Zilly born in 1885. Auguste married Moses Adler from Edelfingen and Zilly married Wilhelm Wälder from Rexingen. Her brothers Alfred, born in 1887 and Salomon, born in 1892, were both killed as soldiers in World War I.

Hedwig Weil married the cattle-dealer and butcher Adolf Sinn from Neckarbischofsheim. He was born on October 25th 1882. They lived in Rexingen. Adolf Sinn was a soldier in World War I, was twice decorated, and died in 1917. Their daughter Loni managed to flee to South Africa in 1936 and married Hugo Schwabacher in Johannesburg.

In 1941 Hedwig was deported to Riga. Her sisters, Auguste Adler and Zilly Wälder, were deported to Theresienstadt on August 22nd 1942. They died there.
